


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Explanation of the Figures above

The first column contains the figures from the current poll.

The Second column is how many seats would be won for each each party based on a swing from the 2016 General Election (with regional polling being used weighted to the national poll average).

The third column is the result of the combination results in Column 2 "adjusted for luck" – essentially taking the total number of constituencies the party was last in, and also runner-up, and then "adjusting" the result based on an equal distribution of luck.

"Left" refers to the figures for Solidarity-People Before Profit and Independents For Change.


Regional Figures are calculated by useing regional sub-samples from the five opinion polls from which they are available, and then calibrating the national figures in those polls against the national figure in the current poll.

Adjusting for "luck"

After all the constituency counts have been calculated, the number of constituencies where a party was last elected and where they were runner-up are totted up, and the overall figure is then adjusted to show the overall figure if there had been an equal distribution of "luck".

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Poll "Bounce"

The five polls taken in the last week - taken as an average - before the General Election in February 2011 were slightly off . In 2016 both Fine Gael and Sinn Fein were over-estimated in the last five polls released on the final weekend of the campaign. The poll averages and the results are shown below :





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What Ireland Might Look Like Under a First Past The Post System

First Past The Post is the electoral system used in the UK – quite simply, the highest poller wins the seat in each constituency. Each FPTP "constituency" is derived from a Dail constituency (i.e. there are five FPTP constituencies within the boundaries of the Donegal Dail constituencies), and support figures are derived from tallies in the majority of cases (and educated guestimates where tallies are not available) – all calibrated to the current poll.
